Kindergarten Staggered Start

Staggered Start is a way for kindergarten students to transition slowly to school. Be sure to sign up for with your child's Kindergarten teacher. Students will attend school in groups of approximately 5 per group, per class, Monday through Thursday (August 10th – 13th). Kindergarten students only attend on the day they are scheduled. Then on Friday, August 14th, all of the kindergarten students attend class together.

Tea and Tissue for Kindergarten Parents

On Friday, August 14th, immediately after walking your child to class, parents are invited to attend Tea and Tissues in the MKY auditorium. Here you can meet some Webster staff members, PTO and socialize with parents in your child's class and make those longstanding connections with other parents in our community.

Volunteers and Picture ID

Each year we like to welcome parents and community members who volunteer to support and enrich the learning that takes place at our school. Please remember to complete the volunteer form online prior to volunteering. This can be found on our district's website. All volunteers must sign in at the front office with a valid picture ID. All parents, guardians and visitors must be show a picture ID and be a registered volunteer to enter the cafeteria, classrooms or school activities during the school day.

Morning Drop Off

A gentle reminder that we cannot accept students any earlier than 8:00 AM in the morning. Students need to stay in their parent's car until a staff member is present to provide supervision. Students should not be left at the parent drop off area unattended.

Walking Students to Class

In the morning students either report to the cafeteria for breakfast or Parents are welcome to walk their students to class during the week of August $10^{th} - 14^{th}$. When students enter the building they either report to the cafeteria for breakfast which begins at 8:00 AM or they report to their classrooms. Students in grades (1-5) have designated and supervised sitting areas outside their classrooms until the first bell rings at 8:20 AM. Students in Kindergarten are escorted to the classrooms either by staff members or our school Ambassadors.

Two Lanes for Parent Pick Up

Parents picking up students in MKY should stay to the right allowing cars to pass on the left. The SJC Sheriff's Dept. also ask that only right hand turns be made in and out of the parking lot to keep traffic flowing. Thank you for continuing to have your child's name visible in the window so your child can be called to come out to the ramp for pick up. We appreciate your cooperation with these procedures.

Wednesday Early Release

Every Wednesday throughout the school year, our school releases at 1:50 PM. This time is set aside for teachers to receive additional training. Thank you for being sure you are at the bus stop or in the parent pick up line one hour before normal dismissal time every Wednesday.

Dismissal and Safety Procedures

To ensure your child's learning environment is not interrupted and to provide sufficient time to communicate dismissal changes to teachers and students all dismissal changes must be received by 2:15 PM on M, T, TH, F by 1:15 PM on Wednesday. Students who need to be checked out early, should be picked up by 2:15 PM on M, T, TH, F and by 1:15 PM on Wednesday. *Thank you for your cooperation and following our safety dismissal procedures.*

Webster is an AVID School

This year The Webster School will be focusing on AVID strategies in grades (K-5). AVID stands for Achievement Via Individual Determination and teaches skills and behaviors for academic success creating a positive peer group for students. Teachers will model and emphasize organizational skills, note taking and critical thinking skills. Students in grades (PreK – 5th) have been provided a binder (OT), a planner and a home communication folder. The purpose of the planner is to serve as an organizational tool (OT) for students to document their homework and behavior each day. This allows parents to view what homework their child has and to assure its completeness. Teachers and parents may also use it as a means to communicate between school and home. Students are



expected to take the planner home each day, get it signed by an adult and return it to school the following day to record assignments and other important dates to remember.

Every Wednesday students and staff can show their AVID spirit by wearing shirts to represent their College and Career goals. <u>Counselor's Corner</u>

When kids are young there is nothing better than spending time with you, their parents. One of the biggest keys to a good relationship is spending time with your children. Sharing in fun brings people closer together. It is important, even in the busy world we live in, to set time aside for your children. Start today and make family night a regular occasion in your house. A few ideas on how to fit quality time in with your kids are Family Game Night, Homemade Pizza Night, or Family Movie Night.

Whether they are starting Kindergarten or 5th grade, the first days of school can be tough for students and parents. Keep in mind that, with good habits and routines, the process will get much easier! Here are some tips for reducing stress and anxiety:

- 1. Start your child's bed-time and wake-time routine at least a week before school starts.
- Talk to you child about the things that are scary and the things that are exciting about school.
 Meet your child's teacher ahead of time. If your child knows that you feel safe and comfortable with the teacher, and they will be more likely to connect.

4. When it is time for your child to go (on the bus, into the building, or into the classroom), say good-bye with a smile and try not to linger. If your child is upset, the teacher needs to be the one to calm them down. Once the relationship is established, the tears will likely disappear!

5. Stay connected. A note in your child's lunch box or a heart in on their hand can remind him that you are thinking of him and that he will see you soon!

6. Follow up. If your child continues to have trouble leaving you, meet with the teacher and/or counselor to find ways to help them. We are all here to make the school experience a happy one!

Community News

The Fountain of Youth Archaeological Park will be celebrating the founding of St. Augustine with their 450th Landing Day Celebration and Thanksgiving Feast on Saturday, September 5, 2015, from 10:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The park itself is open from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. Living history enactors will recreate the landing of Pedro Menéndez de Aviles and will then sit down for a recreated Thanksgiving meal, just like they did in 1565. The Fountain of Youth hosts a celebration of Founder's Day and the original Thanksgiving annually, but this year will be special, as the whole city of St. Augustine celebrates its 450th birthday. Guests attending the reenactment will also have the opportunity to explore the historic grounds of the Fountain of Youth Archaeological Park. There are lots of hands-on activities at the park, including visiting the recreated Timucuan Village of Seloy and climbing a watchtower. There are a variety of shows and demonstrations in the park throughout the day that give visitors a clear picture of what life was like for the early Spanish settlers and the native Timucuans. Admission to the Fountain of Youth is \$15.00 for adults, \$14.00 for seniors, \$9.00 for children, and free for children under 5. For more call (904) 829-3168.
