3rd, 4th, and 5th Graders

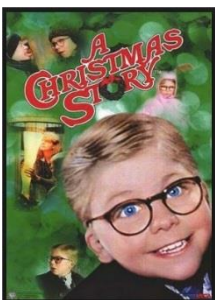
Thursday, December 10th students in third, fourth and fifth grade are welcome to attend our annual Holiday Dance.

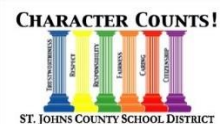
