iReady

One of the new and important aspects of our School Improvement Plan for students in grades (3-5) is a program called iReady. iReady is a diagnostic and adaptive assessment tool that measures children's strengths and weaknesses in specific areas of Reading. These areas include, phonics, phonemic awareness, high frequency words, vocabulary, reading literature and reading informational texts. Data from the reading diagnostic and checkpoint assessments will be used to remediate areas of need and provide enrichment for areas of strength during small group instruction. iReady also provides teachers with resources to meet each students' specific instructional level. The program creates an individual online learning path for each student. Students will work on their individual learning paths 40 minutes per week in the computer lab. Students can also practice at home by going to www.login.i-ready.com. Students have been given their usernames and passwords, but if you have any questions please contact your child's teacher.

Curriculum Newsletters

This year parents will receive a monthly curriculum newsletter from their child's grade level. These newsletters will provide you with information with regard to what your child is learning about in all subject areas. We encourage you to ask your child questions about AVID and the goals he or she has set for themselves.

Volunteers and Picture ID

Each year we like to welcome parents and community members who volunteer to support and enrich the learning that takes place at our school. Please remember to complete the volunteer form online prior to volunteering. This can be found on our district's website. All volunteers must sign in at the front office with a valid picture ID. All parents, guardians and visitors must show a picture ID and be a registered volunteer to enter the cafeteria, classrooms or school activities during the school day.

Two Lanes for Parent Pick Up

Parents picking up students who need special assistance should stay to the right allowing cars to pass on the left. The SJC Sheriff's Dept. also asks that only right hand turns be made in and out of the parking lot to keep traffic flowing. Thank you for continuing to have your child's name visible in the window so your child can be called to come out to the ramp for pick up. We appreciate your cooperation with these procedures.

Webster is an AVID School

This year The Webster School will be focusing on AVID strategies in grades (K-5). AVID stands for Achievement Via Individual Determination and teaches skills and behaviors for academic success creating a positive peer group for students. Teachers will model and emphasize organizational skills, note taking and critical thinking skills. Students in grades (PreK -5^{th}) have been provided a binder (OT), a planner and a home communication folder. The purpose of the planner is to serve as an organizational tool (OT) for students to document their homework and behavior each day. This allows parents to view what homework their child has and to assure its completeness.



Teachers and parents may also use it as a means to communicate between school and home. Stu-

dents are expected to take the planner home each day, get it signed by an adult and return it to school the following day to record assignments and other important dates to remember.

Attendance & Tardies

Regular school attendance is a necessary part of a student's education. Excessive absences and tardies impairs a child's educational progress and can impact whether the child passes or fails a grade.
